Opening Prayer (Unison)

As we regather in your holy name may we regain a sense of community in which others are a blessing and in each other's presence may we find you present to each of us. Hold us God, heal us Living Christ, guide us Holy Spirit into your sacred realm with and through the presence of each other. Amen.
